'Must Do's in Topsail Beach

When you decide to take some time away from the beach, here is a suggestion of attractions, activities, and dining experiences that visitors can add to their "must do" in Topsail Beach!

Missiles and More Museum—Did you know we wouldn't have a space program were it not for the rocket and missile technology developed here on Topsail Island? The Missiles and More Museum is located in the Assembly Building, where test rockets and missiles were assembled. The rockets were taken by wooden cart tracks to the launch pad (which is now the patio deck at Jolly Roger Inn). The museum documents the rocket program, called Operation Bumblebee, as well as offers exhibits on pirates, sea shells, and early female military pilots.

Aquarium Program — For five Wednesdays in the summer, beginning June 29, the Assembly Building and the Historical Society of Topsail Island hosts the Fort Fisher Aquarium staff for programs on topics such as dinosaurs, jelly fish, and more. The programs, designed for school-age children and families, are one hour long, beginning at 1 p.m. The programs are free.

Bingo! - The Historical Society of Topsail Island hosts Thursday night Bingo! during the summer, through Aug. 11. Doors open at 6 p.m. This is fun for the entire family.
